Item 1. State the name of the corporation that is being dissolved.

Item 2. Provide the date that the dissolution was duly authorized by the corporation.

Item 3. This statement is required by Wisconsin law. By signing and filing these articles of dissolution, the corporation confirms that this statement is true.

Item 4. Mark the applicable box(es) to indicate whether approval of the members or a third person is required—and if so, to confirm that the proper approvals were obtained. To determine whether approval of the members or a third person is required, review section [181.1401](#) of the Wisconsin Statutes and the corporation’s articles of incorporation and bylaws.

Item 5. This document must be executed by a person authorized by the corporation.

Optional reduced exclusivity period. The optional bulleted item concerns the post-dissolution use of the corporate name. By default, a dissolving corporation retains the exclusive use of its corporate name for a 120-day period following the effective date of its articles of dissolution. A dissolving corporation can choose to shorten that period of exclusive use by so indicating on this form. Note that a dissolving corporation cannot use this form to lengthen the 120-day default period of exclusive use. If the dissolving corporation seeks to retain the exclusive use of the name for a longer period, it must register its name with the Department as provided under section [181.0403](#), Wis. Stats.

Optional delayed effective date/time. This document may declare a delayed effective date and time. The effective date/time may not be before, or more than 90 days after, the document is received by the Department of Financial Institutions for filing. If no effective date/time is specified, the document will take effect at the close of business on the date it is received for filing by the Department.

Drafter name. If the document is executed in Wisconsin, section 182.01(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes requires that it include the name of the drafter. If the document is not executed in Wisconsin, so indicate in the space provided for the drafter’s name.
